1. Review Request of Variance for Sewer Service to Non-Adjacent Parcel - Tennyson

Antonio Ramirez presented the request of a variance for Sewer Service to a Non-adjacent parcel – Tennyson.

The Committee inquired and staff responded to the following:

- Customer issue: Why they submitted the request for a variance. Property owner has failed septic system and prefers sewer connection to TUD versus repairing the septic system.
- Explained preferred route is via gravity vs. connecting to an adjacent sewer main.
- Connecting to adjacent main would involve, pumping, new electrical service, impact to retaining walls and old concrete.
- The adjacent sewer line is 5" VC and in poor condition. Pumping into it could create additional problems.
- Possible future connections and fees. Tennyson parcel would pay capacity fees at project completion and intervening parcel, which is currently vacant, would pay capacity fees when service is requested.
- In-ground or elevated pipeline with slope and elevation change at location. Private sewer line would be constructed entirely underground with inline cleanouts.

Committee Recommendation: The Committee recommended that this item be presented to the Board of Directors for review and approval at the February 22, 2022 Regular Board meeting.

2. Discuss the Reclamation Luncheon for 2022

Eric Hall began discussion regarding the Reclamation Luncheon for 2022.

Director Ringen requested staff provide a presentation at the luncheon on Quartz Reservoir and staff efforts to provide additional well water into the systems and the cost incurred by the District. Director Boatright also requested that staff include how much additional well water was added to the systems in previous years.

Committee Recommendation: The Committee recommended staff look for cost effective locations with indoor/outdoor options and COVID-19 compliant.
